Wow! It has been an eventful month here at the South Coast Gospel Mission. This Month the Mission got Covid. Yes that still happens I guess. We were blessed to have two baptisms at the Mission, praise the Lord! The hot water heater for the kitchen quit working and the fire department was called. Everything turned out o.k.. The Toyota truck that was being used for landscaping was rearended. We started a new Friday bible study, thank you Ede Clarke and we also started a new sewing class. Busy!

Melissa has been wanting Kurt and Bonnie Smith to baptize her at the Mission for some time but Covid reared its ugly head and it was delayed a few weeks. Then it finally happened. For Melissa her baptism was a rededication to her Lord Jesus Christ. When Mellissa was thirty-two she became addicted to pain pills after surgery. Her pain pill addiction would turn into a Methamphetamine addiction and for the last twelve years she has struggled. Finally, after experiencing homelessness, she decided to give herself back to the God she knew could heal her.

Melissa says her journey through sobriety feels different this time as she is dependent on Gods grace. The fellowship she has found at the Mission has made a real impact. She now has almost ninety days of sobriety. She is attending drug and alcohol classes at Bay Area First Step. Please keep Melissa in your prayers as she has an upcoming eye surgery.

Steve has been a resident of the Mission for four months and a resident staff for three. When I asked Steve about his baptism the word he used was commitment. He wanted to be committed to Jesus Christ. Steve grew up in Bandon but has been living in Death Valley for the last couple of years working for the Parks and Recreation Department. He moved back to Coos County to be closer to home after his mom had a heart attack while taking care of his grandfather who is battling cancer.

God would call Steve to the discipleship program here at the Mission where he quickly made himself invaluable as a resident staff member. Gods word does not return void and it was because he heard the Word being preached here at the Mission that Steve decided to commit himself to Jesus Christ.

Steve has a job at the Edge Water Inn and has enrolled in classes at South Western Oregon Community College for this fall. He attends Hauser Church. His favorite bible verse is; Matthew 6:34 "Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about its own things. Sufficient for the day is its' own trouble."
